


MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING  
BETWEEN  
PRINCE OF SONGKLA UNIVERSITY  
AND  
UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHAMPTON

- 1 Prince of Songkla University and the University of Southampton hereby agree to encourage academic co-operation through research and study in furtherance of the advancement of learning.
  - (1) To encourage visits by faculties from one university to the other for the purpose of engaging in research;
  - (2) To facilitate the admission of qualified students from one university to the other for the purpose of enrolling in undergraduate and graduate programmes, and in the case of advanced student, participating in research;
  - (3) To foster the exchange of academic publications information; and
  - (4) To promote other academic activities which enhance the above mentioned goals.
- 2 Both universities acknowledge that the visit by the faculty and students from one university to the other shall be subject to the entry and visa regulations of Thailand and the United Kingdom, and must comply with the regulation and policies of the Prince of Songkla University and the University of Southampton;
- 3 Both universities agree that all expenses, including research material, international and domestic travel, per diem, honoraria and all other costs, shall be the responsibility of the home university and determined on a case-by-case basis. However, each side will do its utmost to make available university accommodation to visiting faculties and students.
- 4 Both universities agree to review this Memorandum of Understanding after five years following the date of signing, and acknowledge that this Memorandum is subject to revision and termination at any time by mutual consent or by six-months' notice by either party.
